USS BUFFALO


Living in Buffalo, we are familiar with the Naval Park on the waterfront with the USS Sullivans, USS Little Rock and USS Croaker moored there. Most Buffalonians are not aware that there were three ships, two which actively sailed, named for Buffalo.

The last ship named for Buffalo was a Los Angeles-class nuclear attack submarine (SSN-715) commissioned on November 5, 1983 and decommissioned on January 30, 2019. The *Buffalo* served in both the Atlantic and Pacific fleets based in Virginia and Pearl Harbor.





The *Buffalo* participated numerous deployments connected with national security objectives and was awarded numerous commendations including battle awards.



Navy Day was established on October 27, 1920 by the Navy League of the United States in commemoration of past and present services of the Navy. As President Warren Harding said, "From our earliest national beginnings the Navy has always been, and deserved to be, an object of special pride to the American people."

After decommissioning in 2019, the *USS Buffalo* is sitting in a naval yard pending "disposal". Wouldn't it be wonderful if the *Buffalo* could make a return to its namesake city and rest with its cousins?

2020-2021 CLUB DUES & MEMBER INFO


