#### **POSTAL HISTORY RESEARCH**

Typical lots at the Club auctions include boxes of covers. Covers are scrutinized for stamps, cancels, markings, rates and routes. However, covers are also desirable for advertising and the addressee. Just ask Larry Cherns!



The above cover was found in a box of covers purchased at a Club auction. A dozen of the covers had interesting machine cancels from different US cities. They all were addressed to the same person in Buffalo, Dr. Amelia Earle Trant. Since Larry is stuck in Canada unable to attend Club meetings, I will ask the question: Who was Amelia Trant?

Amelia Trant was born in Colden, NY in 1853 to Francis Webber Trant and Anne Amelia Earle Trant. Her family moved to Buffalo when she was young. She began a 50-year career in teaching after graduating high school in 1869. In 1894, she graduated cum laude with a degree in medicine from the University of Buffalo but turned her attention back to the Buffalo schools. She was instrumental in the opening of Masten High School in 1897.

Dr. Trant was a life member of the Buffalo Fine Arts Academy. She was also, for many years, treasurer of the famous women's literary club, The Scribblers.



During the Buffalo Centennial celebration in 1932, the Buffalo Times presented Dr. Trant with a medal as the most distinguished woman in the field of education.

Although she had a medical degree, Dr. Trant's long time goal was a B.A. degree in education that was not available to her in her younger years. After her retirement in 1925, she re-enrolled at U.B. and earned her B.A. degree in education.

Dr. Amelia Earle Trant died on July 11, 1947, at the age of 94. She is buried in the family lot at Forest Lawn Cemetery.



The cover, dated August 23, 1911, was addressed to Dr. Trant at the Markeen Hotel (shown above) in Buffalo which was located at the corner of Main & Utica, where she evidently owned an apartment. The building was demolished in 1966 and the corner now has a Metrorail station.



John Leszak identified the collector as Chris Pieczynski who was a member of the Club in the mid 1980's. He was active in starting the USS BUFFALO Chapter of the Universal Ship Cancellation Society. His family was involved with the startup of the Naval Park in Buffalo. He was an Eagle Scout and even worked for John Leszak at the Cover Connection in the early 1980's. He then joined the US Navy for a career. He was an avid exhibitor, and his last known address was in Virginia.

In 1985, he won the Emil Auer Award for Best 1st Time Exhibit by a Club Member for his "Naval War 1812" exhibit. In 1986, he won the Ernie Schuster Award for Best Exhibit for Travel or Transportation for his "US Naval Shore Stations of the Great Lakes" exhibit.
