
BELIEVE IT OR NOT!!



Believe it or not, Dan McNess found the above item in a box of stamps at the youth table. All of the material destined for the youth table are common stamps, most of them donated. The stamps are never sorted but are in boxes or storage containers which the kids will sort through and keep what they like. It is designed to pique their interest in our hobby with the hope they will become full-time collectors.

The above item is an essay with most dealers guessing it was issued during the Banknote era. It pictures a young Abraham Lincoln and is signed by Charles Schlecht. The Scott Specialized Catalog came up with some candidates, but none resembled the vignette pictured above. It was time for serious research to identify this essay.

The closest essay in Scotts was 206-E5 but, again, the vignette did not match. The catalog value for 206-E5 is \$450.

An internet search on eBay resulted in a find matching the essay. The Lincoln vignette was destined for currency and not stamps. Charles Schlecht was an engraver at the American Banknote Company who designed the vignette. It is a die proof on ivory paper.

Dealer Steve Malack states the essay was never used for a US stamp. He also states this particular essay is rare with few known. He was offering 4 different signed cards for \$1,999.

It will appear in a future auction. Hopefully it will sell for more than \$5!



1st SELF-ADHESIVE US STAMP

We are accustomed to self-adhesive stamps today, but not many collectors are aware that the first self-adhesive stamp the USPS issued was a Christmas stamp. In 1974, the USPS experimented with a new type of stamp that did not need to be licked. The new stamps were die-cut, stripped, rouletted, and cut into finished panes. The stamps also had crossed center slits to prevent them from being removed from envelopes and reused. The problem was that the glue on the stamp caused it to yellow, as can be seen on the above pane. Needless to say it would be another 15 years before a self-adhesive stamp would be issued.
