FRACTIONAL POSTAL RATES



The above cover was purchased for the Tonawanda postmark. But what about the 18 ¾ manuscript marking? The cover is docketed September 3, 1843 and correctly pays the rate for a distance of 150-400 miles, Tonawanda to Rome, NY. Why 34 cents instead of 18 or 19 cents? The explanation is the relation of the US Dollar to the Spanish silver dollar during the Colonial Period. The colonies were not allowed to print their own money. However, the Spanish silver dollar coin was popular among the colonists, since its value was based on the weight of silver. The Spanish dollar was worth 8 reals, commonly referred to as "pieces of eight." Each piece or "bit" was worth 12 ½ cents. Two bits were worth 25 cents or a quarter. This is where the term "two bits" originated!

Even following the Coinage Act of 1792, there was limited production of U.S. coins. So, Spanish coins continued to be very common even into the 1850's.

UKRAINE TRIDENT STAMPS

With the crisis between Russia and Ukraine erupting into conflict, we look at the trident overprint stamps of Ukraine.



Russian stamps were overprinted with the trident in 1918 for use in cities located in Ukraine including Kyiv, Odessa, Yekaterinoslav, Kharkiv, Poltava, Podilia, and Kherson. Once Ukraine was absorbed into the Soviet Union in 1919, Soviet stamps were used for postage.



The above trident overprint is a scarce Podilia overprint on Scott 300. Michel catalogs the overprint as Bezirk Podolien 1a. Scott lists the different overprints in the Classic catalogue but it is Michel that goes into greater detail.

This is a very specialized field. Forgeries are abundant as with any overprint stamps from the period. Most are crude but some are very convincing. Happy hunting!


