## **Elbridge Gerry Spaulding**

Buffalo attorney and entrepreneur Elbridge Gerry Spaulding was a leading national political figure of the 19th Century. Born in Summer Hill, Cayuga County, New York on February 24, 1809, he settled in Buffalo in 1834, where he practiced law. He was appointed Buffalo City Clerk in 1838 and elected a city alderman in 1841.

In 1845, he built Spaulding's Exchange, which stood at the intersection of Main and Commercial Streets. The Exchange soon became Buffalo's center of finance and commerce, housing banks, offices for the Erie Canal and several railroads, stores, and a law library. When the Farmers' and Mechanics' Bank moved from Batavia to Buffalo in 1852, the bank relocated here, and Spaulding was elected its president. On May 28, 1864, the former state bank was reorganized as the Farmers' and Mechanics' National Bank and Spaulding remained its president. Spaulding's Exchange survived until 1939, when it was torn down to make way for Memorial Auditorium.

# Elbridge Gerry Spaulding (con't)

Spaulding's meteoric rise in politics began when he was elected Mayor of Buffalo in 1847. In 1848 he was elected to the New York State Assembly and served as chairman of the Canal Committee. In 1849 he was elected to Congress, where he served on the Committee on Foreign Relations. In 1853 he was elected to a two-year term as New York State Treasurer. He was elected to Congress again in 1858, and re-elected in 1860, serving four years on the Ways and Means Committee. During this time, he drafted both the Legal Tender Act and the National Currency Bank Bill, the passage of which led to the establishment of a national paper currency.

Considered Spaulding's greatest accomplishment, this work earned him the title "Father of the Greenback." Spaulding returned to Buffalo in 1863, following his final term in Congress. He died in Buffalo on May 5, 1897 and is buried in Forest Lawn Cemetery.

#### **BOB MEEGAN**



- The Postal History Society Award of Excellence for Postal History




