SPECIMEN STAMPS

I recently added to my collection of British Commonwealth QEII stamps. Included were examples of specimen stamps. In 1879 the Universal Postal Union (UPU) required its member postal administrations to send in examples of its stamps, so the stamps could be distributed to other member states to aid in the detection of forgeries. The stamps were not valid for postage and were overprinted with the word "SPECIMEN". Where English is not the common language, stamps were overprinted with the language of that country.



Some examples have the name "SPECIMEN" perforated (perfins):



Collecting specimen stamps is a specialty. There are different varieties of overprints and perfins. Interestingly, some specimen stamps are worth more than the originals intended for postage! If you happen to see a specimen stamp in the Club auction, grab it and check it carefully!
