Demand for eclipse covers cancelled at BUFPEX and on April 8, the day of the eclipse, has been high. Interestingly, *Linn's* April 22 edition publicized the BUFPEX cancel in its *Postmark Pursuit* section. While the short article focused on the eclipse it did mention BUFPEX show and bourse. President Alan Davis and Alison Potenza from the USPS and other USPS staff have been busy cancelling covers from all over the world.


#### **BSC HISTORY**

The 1940's was a busy decade for the Buffalo Stamp Club. The Club moved from its meeting place at the YMCA on Franklin Street to the new Statler Hotel on Niagara Square across from the newly opened Buffalo City Hall. In 1940, the Club would host the APS 55<sup>th</sup> Annual Convention which ran August 12-16 at the Hotel Statler. The Convention was successful in that it showcased Buffalo attracting collectors from the United States and Canada.

The covers below were purchased at BUFPEX. Both are Buffalo Stamp Club advertising covers. Both are from Robert H. Zahm who was Secretary of the Buffalo Stamp Club during that time. The 134 West Eagle Street address is the Erie County Probation Office. Robert H. Zahm was Probation Director of Erie County.

The first cover was postmarked on December 3, 1941, and the second postmarked on August 29, 1948.





### **FARNHAM DPO**

Post offices which have closed and are no longer in service are known as discontinued post offices or DPO's. Post offices close for a number of reasons including not enough revenue. Most are located in rural areas and are victims of consolidation. The USPS maintains a list of DPO's.

Tim Carey learned that his post office located in Farnham was closing March 30. He managed to obtain last day postmarks and has shared them.



The Farnham Post Office opened on September 18, 1855 with Francis Snow as its first postmaster. The Village of Farnham was incorporated in 1892 and is named after Leroy Farnham, an early settler. The original Post Office was located on Route 249 (Commercial Street) near the Lake Shore Railroad tracks. The present Post Office was located just down the street at 461 Commercial Street.

DPO cancels are a popular collecting area. Postmarks from DPO's that were operating for only a few years are desirable with most being scarce. Collectors build their collection of DPO's by County or State. Thanks Tim.

Then, there it was – 399 Strand. We took a few pictures, walked up to the door and it was CLOSED! Sealed with a letter on the door showing the holiday hours.


I had checked online and saw it was closed for Good Friday and Easter, but it said nothing about a Bank Holiday Monday closure.
