BOARD MEETING

The Board of Directors met on July 18th. The Club received reports on finances and membership. Financially, the Club is doing very well with income generated from auction income and Club donations. The major expenses are the cost of renting the Knights Hall.

Club membership is at 121 members. There was discussion regarding the dues which will remain the same, but the Club is offering free membership to kids under the age of 18 years.

The theme for BUFPEX will be the 200th Anniversary of the Erie Canal. The show cachet will be designed by Paul Moore, and the USPS will have a show cancel available on both days. The Club will also work with the Boy Scouts to hold a merit badge workshop.

President Alan Davis gave an update regarding the portal **Learning About Stamps Online** (LASO). He is encouraging Club members to participate. He is also encouraging a **Stamp Collecting Roundtable** to meet before the Club Auctions to answer any questions and discuss philatelic topics. Volunteers are needed to help lead this initiative.

Two other topics discussed were Membership complaints and auction ground rules. Any complaints should be directed to a Club Officer or Board Member to be addressed. One of the recent complaints involves talking during the auctions. It is difficult to follow and hear bids when there is talking. It is proposed that the practice of no conversations during the auction be reinforced, so as not to cause a disturbance that impacts the ability to hear or participate in the auction. Also, the "Dues" box will be yellow if you still owe or green if you're Paid up.




CLUB PICNIC

SEPTEMBER 26th PRESENTATION

Bob Meegan has volunteered to do the September 26th presentation. Bob will talk about two subjects regarding interesting postal delivery methods that eventually ended due to external factors that were created by changes in transportation and communication systems.

His topics are:

Part 1: C18 and the flight of the Graf Zeppelin.



<u>Part 2</u>: A Summary of the U. S. Special Delivery System.

Air travel by dirigibles was initially marked by great enthusiasm but the disadvantages inevitably led to the decline and eventual demise of the "lighter than air" transportation industry. However, the brief popularity of this unusual transportation system resulted in fascinating postal activity. Several aspects will be displayed and discussed.

Next, there will be an overview of the Special Delivery System of the United States Postal System. The Special Delivery option was first put into effect on October 1, 1885 and lasted until the final day of the service on June 7, 1997. The special delivery service entitled the sender "...to have such letters to immediate delivery at a Special Delivery Office..." The advent of the internet and the growth of nearinstantaneous delivery of messages by computers made this Special Delivery system obsolete. The Post Office adapted to changing conditions and responded by the Express Mail system. The Special Delivery service was available for about 112 years and many interesting examples of this postal service will be presented.

PARIS OLYMPICS

The 2024 Summer Olympics are being held in Paris from July 26 to August 11. Most countries will release stamps to commemorate the event. France released a stamp ahead of the Olympics to celebrate a French staple, the baguette!



The stamps are of the scratch and sniff variety. The stamps received publicity after their release. TV news and the internet exploded with stories of the stamps. However, there was a lot of criticism that the stamps did not actually have the odor of a baguette, but regular bread!

LEARNING ABOUT STAMPS ONLINE (LASO)

A new APS Chapter was recently formed, Learning About Stamps Online or LASO. The Buffalo Stamp Club was involved and supported the formation of this new chapter.
