


ARTICLES NEEDED!!!!

UNIQUE FDC



The above first day cover is unique. The registered cover is backstamped October 13, 1933 in Buffalo, one of the first day cities for the 5 cent Kosciuszko stamp (Scott 734). What makes this a unique cover is that it was sent from the City of Buffalo Mayor's Office and is signed by Mayor Charles E. Roesch. Roesch served one term as the 49th Mayor of Buffalo from 1930 to 1934. The Kosciusko Foundation in Buffalo was instrumental in having Buffalo as one of the first day cities for the Kosciuszko stamp.
