The other day, I was rummaging through eBay offerings when I came across an amazing trove of used Famous Americans, the 35-stamp issue of 1940 (Scott 859-893) that opened stamp honors to people who were not politicians or military officers.



Here, in one offering, were about 500 used copies, including 62 of the 10-centers and more that 130 of the 5s, all being put up to bid by a Georgia seller starting at \$1.99.


I put the item on "watch", uncertain if I really wanted it and certain it would go for more than I would be willing to pay for stamps already in my collection.

I went about an afternoon of watching football on the TV, unaware the item was ending about the same time the Vikings were finishing off the Saints. Back on eBay, I learned that someone identified only as "2...2" had won the lot for \$4.23 plus \$1.50 for postage and handling. What a deal! May "2...2" have fun sorting through the pile coming soon in the mail.

The event forced me to recall my stampcollecting beginnings in 1940 at age 9 with very little money available for the hobby. Chasing down used Famous Americans became something of an obsession. Any waste basket was fair game. The 10s were particularly hard to find. Had the eBay trove fallen into my lap, I would have tried to declare a national holiday and organize a splendid parade. And the neighbors would have wondered if that Gates kid had finally lost it!

LEAP YEAR COVERS

Since 2020 is a leap year, it presents the opportunity to obtain covers postmarked on February 29. In past leap years, it was sometimes difficult to obtain covers, especially if the day fell on a Sunday. This year February 29 falls on a Saturday and, coincidentally, it is the first day of BUFPEX and the United States Postal Service will be at BUFPEX! It is the perfect opportunity to obtain BUFPEX show covers, have them postmarked with the show cancel, and on a leap year day!

Most leap year covers, especially recent covers, are philatelically contrived. Obviously, the same will hold true for BUFPEX 2020 covers postmarked on February 29. But those covers will make interesting additions to postmark collections. The demand for leap year covers postmarked on February 29 will be strong. The Club stands to profit from the sale of BUFPEX covers to collectors outside of the Buffalo area. Don't forget to buy yours before they sell out!



TOPICAL EXHIBITING

In the Nov-Dec issue of ATA's *Topical Time*, there's been a series of articles on Thematic Exhibiting. It's been interesting; here's a summary:

- For a conventional thematic exhibit, use only philatelic material from the traditional, postal history, postal stationery, revenue and maxi card exhibit types, and define as a "thematic exhibit".
- 2. To include other sorts of philatelic material, such as postcards or advertising covers, define as a "thematically organized exhibit".
- To tell a thematic story using other collateral material, as well as philatelic material, define as a "thematically organized Display exhibit".

Just explain on the title page and in the synopsis what you are presenting.

More discussion is forthcoming to further clarify the APS exhibiting guidelines.
